

If you want to get involved please reach out to one of the Bridge members to see where & what we need assistance with for the rest of the season. We are fairly new boaters (2019) and we always learn a little something each year about boat maintenance. This year we learned that the waste tank charcoal filter needs to be changed out seasonally or you can have a pretty stinky boat. So if your boat is getting smelly even after a pump out, ask yourself when is the last time you changed that out? Clean strainers keep the AC cold and water flowing through the unit. We had to learn about the silly Sea Cock the hard way year one, and clean the inside the cabin filters as well. Impellers were something new year 2 for us, turns out you need those to run the boat and they need changed every year or two. Don't use bleach or harsh toilet cleaner in the head, it will ruin your waste lines, and same for too much bleach in the water tank, use cheap vodka or vinegar instead with a water filter on your hose.



4 ounces Pineapple Juice 1 ounce Orange Juice 1 ounce Cream of Coconut. Pour mixture over rum/ice. Garnish with grated fresh Nutmeg (or use ground Nutmeg spice)


