




friends. The frigid temperatures outside permeated the hotel, but it didn't take long for the party to heat up.



ONCE IN A LIFETIME VIEW

Boating Safety During the Eclipse on the Ohio River

t was 1806 when the last solar eclipse passed by Cincinnati . On **April 8**, a **total solar eclipse** will grace the skies, casting a shadow across the region and the Ohio River or nearby lakes may give one of the most remarkable views.

If you're planning to witness the **2024 solar eclipse** from the Ohio River, here are some tips to ensure a memorable and safe experience:

Location Matters: Choose a spot on the Ohio River where you can have an unobstructed view of the sky. Avoid areas with excessive light pollution. Being on the water allows you to enjoy unobstructed panoramic views of the







eclipse, but check river quality and speed!

Eclipse Path: The Ohio River offers a unique perspective for viewing the celestial event, with the best views heading down river.

- **Partial Eclipse Start**: The moon will begin to pass in front of the sun at **1:53 p.m.**
- Totality: The most awe-inspiring moment will occur from 3:08 to 3:19 p.m., when the moon completely obscures the sun, plunging the area into temporary darkness.
- Path Across Ohio: The eclipse's path will cut a swath from southwest to northeast Ohio, touching cities along the way.
- Duration in Cincinnati: In Cincinnati, you'll experience a partial eclipse around 3:09 p.m.

Safety Gear and Navigation Tools:


- Invest in certified eclipse viewing glasses to protect your vision while observing the sun.
- Ensure your boat is equipped with all necessary safety gear, especially during low-light conditions.
- Running lights are required for all boats, and anchor lights are necessary for powerdriven boats and sailboats at anchor.

Be safe and enjoy the celestial spectacle!

Membership


I'm working on updating membership materials and renewals as the starting point for my new role. I'll be seeing everyone on the docks and can't wait to get new members connected with FSYC.

I'm getting the website updated to go along with Spond as our new member database and app to stay more connected. You can always check out the site for pictures and upcoming events.






