





On the River

In Lawrenceburg there is Captain Mike's RiverWatch floating restaurant and bar. The outside seating is the old Barleycorns barge. My favorite is the Italian sub sandwich. Next to the Applewood in Aurora, there is the Aurora Landing. It's another nice place to eat outside. We like to get a pizza with everything.

Mexican

There are two Acapulco Mexican Restaurants nearby. There's one in Rising Sun and one in Aurora. My favorite is the Fiesta Fajitas. Those jalapenos will fire you up.

Inexpensive

You get a lot for your money at the Riverhouse Bar and

Grill in Rising Sun. They have sandwiches and pizza. Debbie and I get a 12 inch loaded pizza for next to nothing. Debbie will eat at most two slices. I should stop at two, but I eat three. The rest are leftovers for the next day's lunch. We try to get in and out early as the band starts up early evening and they are loud.

Fine Dining

In Rising Sun, I recommend the Courtyard of Rising Sun. You can eat inside or out. They have pleasant live music outside. I like the ribs. In Aurora we like the 3rd and Main Historic Restaurant and Tavern. You can eat inside or out. I highly recommend their pork chops. For a lighter fare, have the goat cheese raviolis. The restaurant recently changed owners, then back to the original owners. Doug says he is going to bring back his famous prime rib hash for Sunday brunch. I can't wait.

River History from Captain Tom Dalton,

Many years ago, circa 1940, my Mom and Dad and my dad's brothers boated on the beautiful Ohio, in what was called the Upper Pool (between the Coney Island Dam and the New Richmond Dam). My folks had a "Scow" (or houseboat) and a few boaters owned the "lesser" craft known as sailboats. Their home port was Neptune Harbor. There was no Yacht Club per se, as the depression had taken its toll. There was however, a great deal of camaraderie among the participants of a Mythical land fondly known as "Peasleville" in the area known as "Sweetwine", Ohio. The exploits of this group made the local news paper columns on more than one occasion. I found scores of these articles among my mother's scrap books ranging from interviews to poetry, it all made the column of Nixon Denton, Sports Editor. My Uncle John penned many of these with tongue in cheek. They speak of" stuffing boxes", constant mechanical problems, caulking wooden hulls and mention nothing of fuel injection, automatic bilge pumps, computerized battery chargers, electronic ignition, or rubbing compound, fiberglass or other such modern marvels. A successful boat outing was one where the craft returned to the harbor, unaccompanied by a towing vessel, and where the engine may have run totally uninterrupted for the entire duration of the voyage (bilge pump operation was a given). The third and final course will be held on August 28th. and the topic will be "Locking Through". We are considering making a trip to Meldahl for this course.
