

From the Rear Commodore



Health and Welfare



July has been designated as national air conditioner appreciation month. It just so happens that we have Willis Haviland Carrier, the Father of Cool, to thank for the invention of air-conditioning.

This brilliant man from Cornell University invented the chill making machine in 1902 – and we certainly needed it in July 2012. More than once I witnessed empty docks due to the July heat wave...and August doesn't look to be much better.

So as the outside temperature continues to increase this may be a good time to remind everyone of the importance of food safety.

There are really only 2 rules for food safety

Rule 1... Keep hot foods hot (140 degrees)
Rule 2....Keep cold foods cold (40 degrees or lower)

I've uncovered these simple guidelines for food safety and would like to share them with you.

Plan ahead: decide what you are going to eat and how you are going to cook it; then plan what equipment you will need.

Pack safely: use an insulated cooler or pack foods that have been frozen.

Never bring meat or poultry products without a cold source to keep them safe.

If using a cooler, leftover food is safe only if the cooler still has ice in it. Otherwise, discard leftover food.

Keep raw foods separate from other foods.

Protect yourself and your family by washing your hands before and after handling food.

Following these common sense guidelines will ensure that you and your friends will be safe when you share your next meal together.

Ingredients

 $10 \ fresh \ mint \ leaves$

1/2 lime, cut into 4 wedges

2 tablespoons white sugar, or to taste

1 cup ice cubes

1 1/2 fluid ounces white rum

1/2 cup club soda



Directions

Place mint leaves and 1 lime wedge into a sturdy glass.

Use a muddler to crush the

mint and lime to release the mint oils and lime juice. Add 2 more lime wedges and the sugar, and muddle again to release the lime juice. Do not strain the mixture. Fill the glass almost to the top with ice. Pour the rum over the ice, and fill the glass with carbonated water. Stir, taste, and add more sugar if desired. Garnish with the remaining lime wedge.

Fishing Tournament

The 3rd Annual FSYC Fishing Tournament was held Saturday, May 26, 2012. Approximately 45 enjoyed a day of fishing, prizes, and catered lunch at the Clubhouse.

A total of 85 fish were caught that day (plus 1 turtle). All were released and returned safely to the marina waters. Awards went to Jacob Woeste for the Biggest Fish (a 32" gar), Aeryka Merritt for the Smallest Fish (4 3/4"), Zack Hartman for the Most Fish Ages 12 & under (caught 13), and Cameron Roesel for the Most Fish Ages over 12 (caught 13).

This year's catch count was the highest ever with 85 fish and 1 turtle. In comparison, 27 was the count in 2011 (high water year) and 63 in 2010. The biggest fish hit an all time record this year at 32" compared to 18" in 2011 and 17 1/2" in 2010. The smallest this year was also a new record at 4 3/4" compared to 6 1/2" in 2011 and 5 5/8" in 2010. With the most fish caught by one angler in each age group coming in at 13 this year, we were down a bit from the record of 20 set in 2010.



Attendance has ranged from 45 this year to 50 in 2011 and 40 in 2010, so this continues to be a great event.

A huge thank you goes out to those yacht club members who donated prizes for the random drawings. Everyone in attendance had a chance to win Reds tickets, a fish pillow, and an awesome chocolate fish!

These prizes were over and above the trophies and fishing-related prizes won by those named earlier. A great time was had by all. Looking forward to next year.....plenty of time between now and then to practice the perfect cast!




I am also happy to report that the Club is in good financial shape as we have met our membership goal for the year. As you may know we base our operating budget on the number of members for the clubs operating capital.


