


### **We Need Your Help!**

### **Safety Tip**

NAVIGATION RULES, SUBPART II, RULE 15 (b)

Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on the Great Lakes, Western Rivers, or waters specified by the Secretary, a power-driven vessel crossing a river shall keep out of the way of a power-driven vessel ascending or descending the river. The Ohio is one of the Western Rivers so please remember that when you depart the marina you must give way to all upbound or downbound power-driven vessels and, (Rule 16) so far as possible, you must "take early and substantial action to remain well clear".

### **From the Galley**



### Margarita Shrimp Cocktail

5 tablespoons olive oil

1 ½ pounds large uncooked shrimp
½ cup minced green onion
2 large garlic cloves
¼ cup tequila
2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
1 teaspoon Margarita salt
2 small limes, cut into wedges
2 tablespoons fresh lime juice

At Home Preparation: Peel and de-vein shrimp and place in a container. Mince the green onion, including some of the green tops and place in container with shrimp. Mince the garlic and add to container with shrimp and green onion.

On Board Preparation: Cut limes into wedges (for garnish) and set aside. Heat the olive oil in a skillet over medium-high heat. Add the container of shrimp, green onion and garlic, cooking 1 minute stirring constantly. Remove from heat; add the tequila. Return to heat. Bring to boil, scraping up any browned bits in the pan. Remove from heat. Toss with 2 tbs fresh lime juice and Margarita salt. If serving cold, refrigerate about 1 hour or until chilled. For garnish, dip the rims of six Margarita glasses or serving bowls in the additional lime juice then into Margarita salt (if desired). Divide the shrimp mixture evenly among the glasses and garnish with a lime wedge.

### SAFE BOATING TIPS FROM D DOCK

The Tie that Binds

When stretched and wrapped under tension, Rescue Tape immediately cures into one solid piece of silicone, creating an airtight and watertight seal. With a breaking strength of 700 psi, it is said to be the strongest repair tape on the market. As long as you overlap Rescue Tape onto itself, it will work even if the surface is wet, dirty or oily. You should, however, avoid getting dirt or oil between the layers, since this will interfere with the bonding process. Unlike some other "selfamalgamating" tapes, Rescue Tape doesn't unravel, yet it is easily removed with a knife or scissors. Moreover, it isn't gummy or sticky like duct tape or electrical tape, and it leaves no residue. Harbor Products claims an insulating value of 8,000 volts per layer, making this tape an improvement over heat-shrink tubing for electrical connections and repairs. Once cured, it resists the temperatures up to 500 degrees F (260C). If they choose clear Rescue Tape, boaters can wrap and waterproof electrical connections, yet still be able to visually inspect the connection for corrosion or damage. The color of and print on the wiring will remain visible, as well. This is especially beneficial for coax cables or installation of marine electronics. Standard rolls (20 mil thick x 1" wide x 12" long) are available in eight colors, for about \$10 per roll. 


