


#### **B-Dock News**

#### Going in reverse.

don't know what you have been doing all winter but I have been working on a solution to Osama Obama's high gas prices. I just realized that the entire boating process is reversible. Now is the time to act while the river is high and flowing, there is no time to waste. Here's what to do: Use those few last precious gallons of fuel to get your fiberglass dinosaur out into the river. Find a spot where the current is very strong right in the middle of the commercial channel then quickly drop anchor. Now comes the important part...Leave the ignition on and put the transmission in gear! Those of you with a background in thermodynamics and chemistry may already know what comes next. The fast flowing river water will cause the propellers to rotate in reverse. This turbine action will turn the prop shaft and force the engine to operate in reverse. It's like a backwards Otto cycle\*.

Filthy carbon fowled Cincinnati air will be drawn in thorough the engines exhaust ports. As the pistons slowly move up and down the spark will ignite and pure untaxed gasoline will ooze out of the carburetor. It is a slow process, but with patience the precious octane juice will drool down the side of the engine block and accumulate in the bilge. By re-arranging a few hoses you can pump the compound right into your fuel tank! If the bilge is not clean divert the first few gallons overboard.



As with any volatile chemical process it is recommended that you avoid smoking around the engine compartment. When the tanks are full, pull up the anchor and enjoy boating with a sparkling clean engine compartment as a by-product. Remember to practice safe boating, let the barge captains know that they need to steer clear while your chemical reaction is taking place. Have a great summer boating with free gasoline!
