

Cincinnati Sail & Power Squadron

Subject: E15 and potential damages to your boat **Message:** The EPA to allow 15% renewable fuel in gasoline!

The EPA has approved the first applications for registration of ethanol for use in making gasoline that contains up to 15% ethanol--known as E15. In testimony at a Congressional Hearing on E15 Damage a representative from Mercury Marine testified that their engine testing demonstrated significant problems including severe valve damage, deterioration of the fuel pump gasket, excess carbon deposits and compatibility issues with other materials in the fuel systems. These tests, along with previous tests, demonstrate the risk of engine failure and increased costs to our boats. The D.C. Circuit Court scheduled oral arguments for April 17 in a case challenging the EPA action.

Health and Welfare



Greetings FSYC Club Members.

Hello, my name is Sherill Pattison. I am

Commodore Bob Pattison's wife and have taken
on the duties of communicating Club Health
and Welfare Issues. In this capacity, I plan to
post health articles of interest to our members

in newsletters as well as sending personal cards on behalf of the club membership to those who may be ill. injured, have a loss, or just in need of a card. If you know of a member in need of a card please let me know. I look forward to speaking with you through our newsletters or in person at the Marina.



You may not be aware but over the past 20 years, the Month of April has been designated as Stress Awareness Month. (Humm, I wonder if it there is a correlation with our Tax submission deadline.) During this month health care professionals will raise public awareness about both the causes and cures for our modern stress epidemic. Healthcare professions say there are many natural remedies you can use to help you manage stress, depression and anxiety. Here are two.

- **1. Be Hydrated. Drink water.** It is vital that your body has sufficient water to carry out of all the necessary functions efficiently. Yet an estimated seventy-five percent of people living in the United States don't drink enough water which causes mental exhaustion, fuzzy thinking and places stress on the body to function effectively. A daily intake of only 4 or 5 glasses of water along with the fluids supplied by your diet and other drinks will soon bring noticeable results.
- 2. Protect Mind and Body A fatty acid that has proven to be beneficial is Omega 3. It can protect you from health problems such as stroke and heart disease, blood clotting, Alzheimer's disease and strengthen the immune system. When it comes to stress and anxiety studies have shown that Omega 3 reduces hypertension. Omega 3 is found in extra virgin olive oil, oily fish such as sardines, herrings and swordfish and vegetables including lettuce and eggplant. Omega 3 is also available in fish oil supplements. Avocados have long been known for their stress busting abilities. Here is a recipe that is so easy and elegant you'll want to serve it at the next party on your dock.

Shrimp & Avocado Appetizers:

¼ cup reduced calorie mayonnaise, 1 tsp wasabi paste, ½ tsp soy sauce, Cucumbers – seedless cut into twenty four ¼ inch slices, avocado trimmed, quartered and then cut into 24 slices, 8 oz cooked shrimp, about 24 small, peeled and deveined, 2 Tbsp fresh radishes, finely chopped, ¼ cut mint leaves, left whole (for garnish).

To make wasabi mayonnaise, in a small bowl, stir together mayonnaise, wasabi paste and soy sauce until smooth. To assemble appetizers, place cucumber slices on a serving platter and spread each with 1/2 teaspoon of wasabi

mayonnaise. Place a slice of avocado on top and then top each with a shrimp; sprinkle with radish and top with a mint leaf.

Yields 2 appetizers per serving.




