



River News

Shawnee State Marina (740-858-6652) at River Mile 363, just a couple miles west of Portsmouth, OH, is undergoing a huge renovation this summer.

They are dredging the marina and access ways from the river so they can accommodate larger boats in the 50 foot range, as well as improving their docks and facilities. They will have slips for boats up to the 50 range and will provide 30 and 50 amp power. They will not have a fuel dock at the marina but will have access to delivery service called Weavers (740-858-6031) who will deliver fuel in minimum 100 gal loads.

The renovation at Shawnee State Marina is expected to be complete between 8/15 and 8/31/2013.



Health and Welfare



Just when you thought we had turned the cold, wet weather corner another bout of rain and an insulting cold front comes and slaps us in the face. Rain, rain rain. It has become an annoying pattern. It is also a dangerous to your health as it can create


symptoms of Vitamin D deficiency. The lack of vitamin D can cause serious medical problems.

We need Mother Nature's sun to help our trigger the vitamin D synthesis in the skin, which is key for aiding in the absorption of calcium for our bones. This important sunshine vitamin helps strengthen our immune system, is critical for normal development and growth of cells and bones and could play a role in the prevention and treatment of a number of different conditions, including type1 and type 2 diabetes, hypertension, glucose intolerance, and multiple sclerosis. It may also be key in helping the brain to keep working well in later life.

wSo how do you get this vitamin into your diet when the sun is hidden by so many rain clouds? Prepare foods rich in vitamin D such as fish, fish liver oils, milk and dairy, eggs, pork, beef and fortified grain products.

So once the rain stops let's get outside and start soaking up small doses of sunlight. But until then here is a salmon recipe that should help boost your vitamin D intake.

Recipes



Caramel Glazed Salmon

Prep/Total Time: 25 min. Yield: 4 Servings

Ingredients:

- 4 salmon fillets (6 ounces each)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted
- 2 teaspoons dill weed

Directions:

- Sprinkle salmon with salt and cayenne; set aside.
- In a small bowl, combine the brown sugar, mustard, butter and dill. Place salmon skin side down on a greased broiler pan.
- Broil 4-6 in. from the heat for 5 minutes. Brush half of the glaze mixture over fillets.
- Broil 7-10 minutes longer or until fish flakes easily with a fork, brushing occasionally with remaining glaze.


